



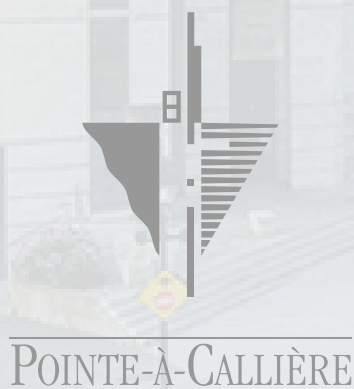
PEER DISCUSSION VENUE



ABOUT THE VENUE: POINTE-À-CALLIÈRE

POINTE-À-CALLIÈRE IS A MUSEUM OF ARCHAEOLOGY AND HISTORY IN OLD MONTREAL, QUEBEC, CANADA. IT WAS FOUNDED IN 1992 AS PART OF CELEBRATIONS TO MARK MONTREAL'S 350TH BIRTHDAY. THE MUSEUM HAS COLLECTIONS OF ARTIFACTS FROM THE FIRST NATIONS OF THE MONTREAL REGION THAT ILLUSTRATE HOW VARIOUS CULTURES COEXISTED AND INTERACTED. POINTE-À-CALLIÈRE IS ONE OF CANADA'S NATIONAL HISTORIC SITES, AND IT HAS RECEIVED MORE THAN FIFTY NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL AWARDS, INCLUDING THOSE IN MUSEOGRAPHY, ARCHITECTURE, AND FOR CULTURAL, EDUCATIONAL AND COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES.

THE MUSEUM COMPLEX COMPRISES THREE ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITES: POINTE-À-CALLIÈRE, PLACE ROYALE AND 214 PLACE D'YOUVILLE; THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL FIELD SCHOOL AT FORT VILLE-MARIE; MONTREAL'S FIRST CATHOLIC CEMETERY; THE WILLIAM COLLECTOR SEWER; AN ARCHAEOLOGICAL CRYPT: PLACE ROYALE; A HERITAGE BUILDING: THE FORMER YOUVILLE PUMPING STATION; 165-169 PLACE D'YOUVILLE THE MARINERS HOUSE AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL COLLECTIONS OF OVER A MILLION OBJECTS.
